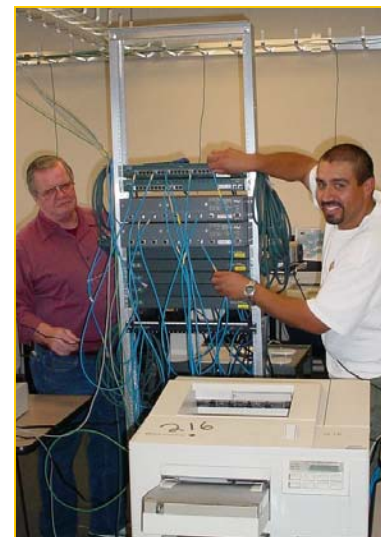

Qualified, skilled personnel are in demand by these type of businesses.

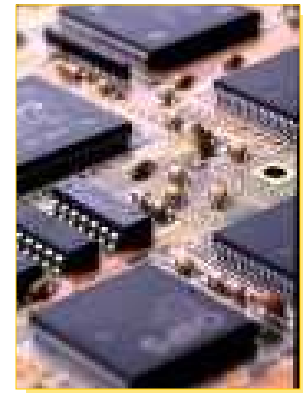


About our Co-Op Program
